ONE COVENANT

PSALMS 115:16 NLT

THE HEAVENS BELONG TO THE LORD, BUT HE HAS GIVEN THE EARTH TO ALL HUMANITY.

Our Heavenly Father created us for his pleasure, to be his family, his image, and his extension. From the very first chapter, the Bible makes it clear that his plan has always been to give us the earth as a perpetual possession; to give us dominion and authority over all that He created. This is our inheritance.

So God created human beings in his own image. In the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. Then God blessed them and said, "Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it. Reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and all the animals that scurry along the ground."

Genesis 1:27-28 NLT

He gave us the earth to rule; He made a covenant of life with our ancestors Adam, Eve, and their family, but through disobedience, chose to go from rulers to slaves. They broke the covenant with their Creator, and as a consequence all of humanity was separated from God.

And to the man he said, "Since you listened to your wife and ate from the tree whose fruit I commanded you not to eat, the ground is cursed because of you. All your life you will struggle to scratch a living from it. It will grow thorns and thistles for you, though you will eat of its grains. By the sweat of your brow will you have food to eat until you return to the ground from which you were made. For you were made from dust, and to dust you will return."

Genesis 3:17-19 NLT

Because of a lack of governance, the whole earth became corrupt and the Lord had to send a flood to cleanse it of wickedness. However, his Word does not change, and in his mercy God made a covenant with Noah and his family; giving hope once again to those who had been separated from God.

Then God blessed Noah and his sons and told them, "Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth. All the animals of the earth, all the birds of the sky, all the small animals that scurry along the ground, and all the fish in the sea will look on you with fear and terror. I have placed them in your power. I have given them to you for food, just as I have given you grain and vegetables."

Then God told Noah and his sons, "I hereby confirm my covenant with you and your descendants..."

Genesis 9:1-3,8-9 NLT

Once again our ancestors disobeyed and the land became filled with wickedness, corruption, and began to manifest characteristics contrary to those of its Creator. It was then that He decided to give a new opportunity through a new family: Abraham, Sarai, and their descendants. In this way, the nation of Israel was born; the chosen people—the children of God.

The Lord had said to Abram, "Leave your native country, your relatives, and your father's family, and go to the land that I will show you. I will make you into a great nation. I will bless you and make you famous, and you will be a blessing to others. I will bless those who bless you and curse those who treat you with contempt. All the families on earth will be blessed through you."

Genesis 12:1-3 NLT

Once again the Lord enters into a covenant with humanity, declaring that if they believe in Him and trust in Him, they will multiply, fill the earth, and rule over it. God's covenant with humankind is to give them the earth as a perpetual possession from generation to generation.

Biblical history is filled with accounts of the lives of kings and leaders who believed in Him and came to rule over their territories. As a result, the Lord increased their influence, giving them more land and more power so that they could carry out his will in increasingly more places on earth. This has been the covenant from the beginning and God does not change his mind; his Word is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Heaven and earth will pass away but his Word will never pass away. God's inheritance for us is still valid today: "The Promised Land."

Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Matthew 28:18-20 NLT

When Jesus ascended to heaven after defeating the one who held the keys of death, the devil was stripped of his authority—the authority he had usurped from God's children. Jesus reclaimed it and, along with it, restored our dominion. He brought us back into the covenant and reclaimed for us the inheritance we had lost: the Promised Land.

That is why he is the one who mediates a new covenant between God and people, so that all who are called can receive the eternal inheritance God has promised them. For Christ died to set them free from the penalty of the sins they had committed under that first covenant.

Hebrews 9:15 NLT

This is the sure hope we have in Him. That we will reign with Him for eternity in the land He promised us; a land without pain, without sadness, without crying.

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the old heaven and the old earth had disappeared. And the sea was also gone. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven like a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. I heard a loud shout from the throne, saying, "Look, God's home is now among his people! He will live with them, and they will be his people. God himself will be with them. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain. All these things are gone forever."

Revelation 21:1-4 NLT

There is only one Covenant of God with humanity; one single promise: the testament. His inheritance for his children is the earth. It is an earth completely subjected to his rule, in which He is King and Lord, and in which his will is fulfilled. This inheritance is reserved for his children, for those who have surrendered to his authority and accepted his Fatherly love to live trusting in Him, submitted to his will and under his Reign.

Our part of the Covenant is to obey his commands and precepts. In this way everything will be according to his design, then his Word (all his promises) will be ours and we will lack nothing.

Application:

- Did you know you had an inheritance to claim?
- Do you understand that your inheritance is the earth, not heaven? Do you know that we are called to bring heaven to earth?
- Do you trust in your Father's plan and design to reclaim all that was lost and give it to you to rule with your descendants?
- Inheritance is given to those named in a will while they are still alive. Are you waiting until you die to claim your inheritance? Do you understand that it is here and now? Heaven on earth begins when you decide to acknowledge Jesus' Lordship in your life and begin to live under his rule.

Prayer

Lord, you are a God of covenants. You never fail on your promise. You are a God who keeps his word, and that will never change. Today I thank you because your covenant promises that you are a God of opportunities, forgiveness, and reconciliation, and I am the beneficiary of this promise. I decide, as your child, to enter into this covenant that you have renewed so that we can govern this land that you promised us. This covenant that you have confirmed with your blood makes me part of an eternal inheritance that assures me that I am one with you, and that I have your authority to govern on this earth.

I decide to believe you and trust you. I decide to enter into this pact where you yourself teach me to govern according to your image and likeness. Holy Spirit, I give you all authority over my life so that you teach me and show me how to submit all things under your authority, to fulfill your will. I enter into a pact with you to carry out your will in my life, and in that way, continue to establish your Kingdom on earth. I renounce every foreign voice that wants to fill me with fear and doubt so that I do not believe in your promises: in your covenant. I accept the responsibility you have given me since you created me, and I know that with your help, I will be a faithful butler who pleases your heart, and a tool through which you fill this earth with your glory. In the name of Jesus. Amen!
