# ONE GOD

EPHESIANS 4:5-6 NLT

***THERE IS ONE LORD, ONE FAITH, ONE BAPTISM, ONE GOD AND FATHER OF ALL, WHO IS OVER ALL, IN ALL, AND LIVING THROUGH ALL.***

There is only one God, one Father, one Creator, and Sustainer of all things. Understanding that everything originated in Him and that nothing exists outside of Him is crucial; otherwise we will live searching elsewhere for the reason for our existence, the purpose of our lives, and the design for how we function.

## **This is the meaning of the word "Father":**

1. Progenitor and Creator: The origin of life. God is the Father of all humanity.
2. Authority and Guide: The head of the family, responsible for the teaching, discipline, and well-being of the home, just as God is for his people.
3. Sustainer of all that flows to the family. In God's case, this refers to his family, his people, and his Church. From Him comes all that is good, all that is perfect, all that human beings need or long for. He is the only source of provision.

Recognizing Him as the one and only God and Lord means that He is our absolute authority; that He determines everything in our lives and that in Him we find the answers to all our questions. It means recognizing that He designed everything so that we know clearly where to turn for help, advice, direction, provision, protection, guidance, and anything else we need.

When we speak of our God, we are not speaking of just any god, but of the one who revealed Himself to Abraham and through him, created a people with their own culture: the culture of heaven, the Hebrew culture. Meaning, the way of thinking of the Heavenly Father, as written in the Holy Scriptures, in the Bible. This culture is different from the culture of the world.

He is our Lord and Father. Only from this perspective and spiritual position can we relate to Him correctly. Otherwise, our expectations will be unrealistic; if we only expect Him to be our friend or our Savior without recognizing Him as the ultimate authority (as the creator and designer of all things), then we will spend our time telling Him our plans and what we want to do with our lives. We will constantly be asking Him to do our will, our desires, giving instructions, and repeating biblical concepts without understanding and without experiencing their fullness. In other words, living a religious life but not the abundant and eternal life for which He chose us.

*The Lord passed in front of Moses, calling out, "Yahweh! The Lord! The God of compassion and mercy! I am slow to anger and filled with unfailing love and faithfulness. I lavish unfailing love to a thousand generations. I forgive iniquity, rebellion, and sin. But I do not excuse the guilty. I lay the sins of the parents upon their children and grandchildren; the entire family is affected—even children in the third and fourth generations."*

**Exodus 34:6-7 NLT**

Our God defines Himself as a good Father and everything that characterizes and represents Him is embedded with his essence of Love: compassion, mercy, patience, joy, kindness, forgiveness, faithfulness, righteousness, steadfastness, and justice. He is available to everyone.

He is not exclusive to a select few. His love shows no partiality and He has no favourites. He loves everyone equally and gives us all the same opportunity to draw near to Him; to return to dwell in his house and to rejoice in being his children.

*For ever since the world was created, people have seen the earth and sky. Through everything God made, they can clearly see his invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature. So they have no excuse for not knowing God.*

**Romans 1:20 NLT**

His love is evident in nature; wherever we look we see his goodness, his abundance, his provision, the way He sustains absolutely everything, and his design that keeps everything functioning perfectly.

The sun always rises in the same place and at the appointed time. The seas, the winds, and the seasons always arrive without fail and have their clear boundaries. Food for all species, on land, in the waters, and even in the air, is guaranteed by his love. As long as humankind exists on Earth there will be sowing and reaping; otherwise, we could not survive. Everything He planned for his children is good, pleasing, and perfect. If we do not live that way, it is not because He desires it but because of our unbelief, which leads us to doubt his love.

Surrendering our arguments and acknowledging Him as the good Father He is, as Lord and King, with all authority over our lives, is the first step to enjoying his love. The first step to begin living as children, is walking daily in our purpose and leaving a legacy in the world, not only in our generation but in the ones to come.

This supremely loving and powerful God has chosen for us to know Him through three different forms of relationship: as Father, as Son, and as a Spirit. It's not about three gods; it's like each of us who are spouses, parents, friends, and mentors to others. This doesn't mean we are multiple people, but rather that being one, we connect in unique ways with our children, spouses, partners, and so on. Three distinct persons but one true God who loves us and wants us to experience Him.

Just as a baby, when born into a family, experiences the love and care of its mother, father, and older siblings, so too does our Heavenly Father want us to experience Him, and to discover that his will for us is good, pleasing, and perfect. His plans for us are for our well-being, not for suffering. He wants to give us a future and a hope. God's desire for his children is that we experience his love as unique, that we have only one God and Father, one Creator and Sustainer of all things. That we are children of the one true God.

**We can do things together, live together, even as husband and wife, and yet not be one; true unity is only found in the Spirit. We can only be ONE in Him.**

#### **Application:**

- Take a moment to contemplate nature, creation, and look for God's invisible qualities in them.
- What has been your concept of God up to this point? How does this influence your desire to know Him as Father and as King or Lord?
- Do you consider your life to be full and abundant in every way?
- How do you understand religiosity? Do you think there is any of it in you?

## Prayer

Father, you are my God, the only true God. Today I recognize you as my Creator, my Provider, my Guide, and my sustenance. Today I recognize you as the only true God, and I recognize that you want to be the Lord of my life. I ask you to give me a humble spirit to learn to obey you. I want to know you more every day of my life, and know more about your Word and your will for my life. I want to have an intimate and true communion with you to learn to be more like you. My desire is to learn to know, do, and love your will, and see your love and your mercy manifesting in my life every day.

Today I decide to start this path of being transformed in my way of thinking, to be able to verify that your will is good, pleasing, and perfect. In the name of Jesus. Amen!
